# Raising Adolescents in a Threatening World

The role of Parents' Threat Beliefs, Eco-Anxiety and Self-Efficacy in Overprotective Parenting and Academic Overinvolvement

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#### PARENT THREAT BELIEFS

- culture of fear (Haidt & Lukianoff, 2018; Furedi, 2008)
- → threat in children's current and future environment in terms of scarcity and instability (Gurland & Grolnick, 2005)
- may make parents more or less sensitive to cues about danger for their children



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#### PARENTS' ECO-ANXIETY

- → negative emotions like worry and anxiety about climate-related risks (Ogunbode et al., 2021)
- →large majority of people see climate change as a major threat to livelihoods, health, places (Hickman et al., 2021)
- -> associated with mental health





#### OVERPROTECTIVE PARENTING

- → level of protection that is excessive considering the child's developmental level (Thomasgard et al., 1995)
- negative outcomes for children
- associated with parent's anxiety

#### ACADEMIC OVERINVOLVEMENT

→ level of parental involvement in the school context that is excessive



#### PARENTAL SELF-EFFICACY

- parents' perception on their capacity to successfully raise their children (Jones and Prinz, 2005)
- predictor of parenting behavior and child outcomes
- → influenced by emotional states (Bandura, 1997)

#### PARENTAL ANXIETY

predictor of overprotective parenting



## Research goals

Parents' beliefs about the world as a threatening place and parents' eco-anxiety

- elicits overprotective parenting and academic overinvolvement?
- role of parental selfefficacy and anxiety?



# Sample

- N= 757 parents of adolescents in Belgium
- 478 mothers (63,1%) and 279 fathers (36,9%)
- Parents' age: M= 49 (5.04)
- Parent's education: 48,3% have a university degree
- Adolescents' age: M = 16.4 (SD = 0.78)
- 53,8% girls and 46.1% boys



### Instruments

#### Overprotective parenting

(10 items, MOPS, Chevrier et al., 2021)

- Anxious OP subscale
- "I often take tasks out of my child's hands without giving him/her the chance to try them by him/herself"
- $\alpha = .82 .82 \text{ (M-F)}$

#### **Academic Overinvolvement**

(4 items, adapted from Chevrier et al., 2021)

- "I am overly concerned about my child's academic performance."
- $\alpha = .79 .72 \text{ (M-F)}$



### Instruments

#### Threat beliefs

(10 items, World Out There, Gurland & Grolnick, 2005)

- "It makes me nervous to think about all the dangers kids are exposed to today"
- $\alpha = .84 .84 \text{ (M-F)}$

#### **Eco-anxiety**

(5 items, adapted from STAI-short, Ogunbode et al., 2021)

- Negative feelings about climate change
- "When I think about climate change, I feel worried"
- $\alpha = .88 .86 \text{ (M-F)}$



### Instruments

#### Parental self-efficacy

(4 items, Maap, Hamilton et al., 2015)

- Global PSE
- "I have confidence in myself as a parent."
- $\alpha = .84 .85 \text{ (M-F)}$

#### Parental anxiety


(5 items, STAI-short, Zsido et al., 2020)

- Trait anxiety
- "I feel that difficulties are piling up so that I cannot overcome them."
- $\alpha = .84 .85 \text{ (M-F)}$




# Analysis strategy

- moderation





# Results



Parental self-efficacy (and anxiety) seem to moderate the relation between threat beliefs and academic overinvolvement

-> for mothers 24

Eco-anxiety is not related to overprotective parenting or academic overinvolvement

-> for mothers and fathers




Parents' threat beliefs are related to anxious overprotective parenting and academic overinvolvement

-> for mothers and fathers



- Parental anxiety is related positively - to anxious overprotection and academic overinvolvement
- PSE is related negatively
  - to overprotection
- -> for mothers and fathers



Moderating role of PSE (and anxiety) in the relation between threat beliefs – academic overinvolvement

- for mothers
- not for fathers

Limitations: no causality - replication
