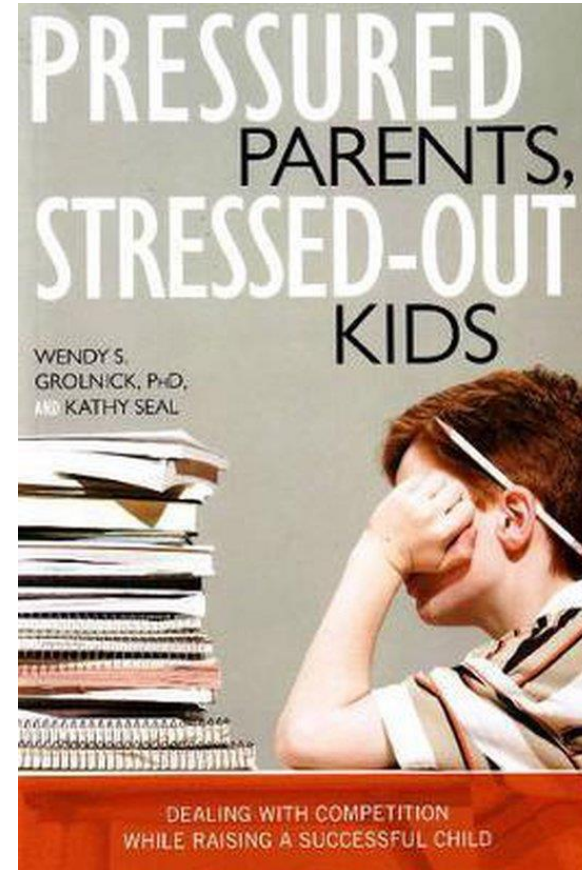

Overprotective parenting

Conceptualization

« The provision of a level of protection that is excessive, considering the child's developmental level » (Thomasgard et al., 1995)

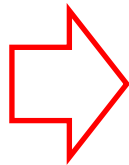
In adolescence and young adulthood, e.g.,

- Intrusiveness

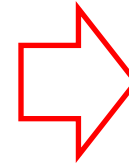

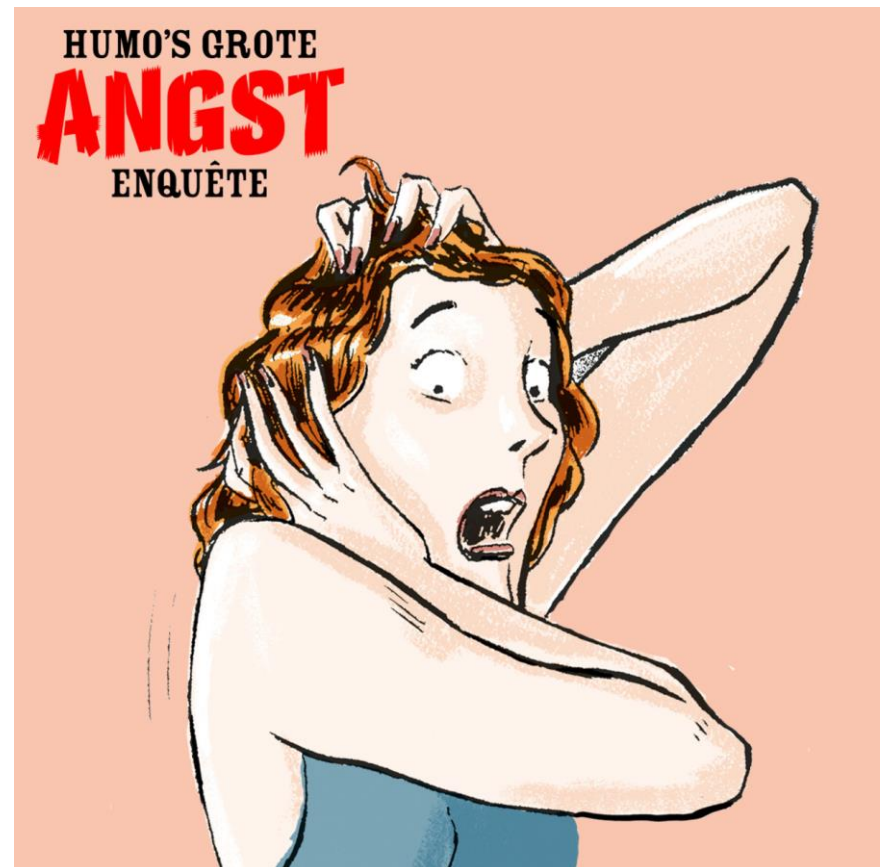
Parental worries

Survey

(HUMO, june 2022)

The Belgians are worried, concerned or afraid about...

Rising prices and the own financial situation	82%
War, terror, and international security	81%
Climate change and extreme weather	73%
Health (incl. mental), pandemics and diseases	70%
Political situation in Belgium and Europe	67%
Refugees and migration	64%
Digitalisation	59%



Parental worries

Potential sources?

Economic insecurity (e.g., Doepke & Zilibotti, 2019)

- Perceived national job insecurity (Shoss et al., 2022)

Dangerous worldviews (e.g., Furedi, 2008)

- Beliefs about the social world as dangerous and threatening (Perry et al., 2013)

Climate anxiety (e.g., Crandon et al., 2022)

- Distress caused by climate change (Coffey et al., 2021)

Present study

Objectives

1) Context-related sources?

- Perceived job insecurity
- Dangerous worldviews
- Climate-related anxiety

→ Predicts parental worries about children's future?

→... and overprotective parenting?

2) Controlling for individual-level factors

- Trait anxiety
- Financial scarcity

Method

Sample

N = 912 Belgian parents of adolescents ($M_{\text{age}} = 17.4$ years)

- 559 mothers (61%)
- Mean age = 47.9 years
- Subjective SES = 4.44 (on 1-10 scale)

- 353 fathers (39%)
- Mean age = 50.2 years
- Subjective SES = 4.06

Data gathered between 03/2022 and 01/2023

Method

Measures

Overprotective parenting (10 items; Chevrier et al., 2022)

- « I immediately see danger whenever my child wants to do something new » ($\alpha = .81/.84$)

Parents' worries (4 items; Gurland & Grolnick, 2005)

- « These are troubling times. Parents these days have reasons to be concerned » ($\alpha = .74/.75$)

Perceived job insecurity (4 items; Shoss et al., 2022)

- « In Belgium, a lot of people feel insecure about the future of their jobs » ($\alpha = .74/.81$)

Method

Measures

Dangerous worldviews (6 items; Perry et al. 2013)

- « There are many dangerous people in our society who will attack someone out of pure meanness, for no reason at all » ($\alpha = .82/.84$)

Negative climate-related emotions (5 items; Ogunbode et al., 2021)

- « When I think about climate change, I feel anxious » ($\alpha = .82/.84$)

Parental trait anxiety (5 items; Zsido et al., 2020)

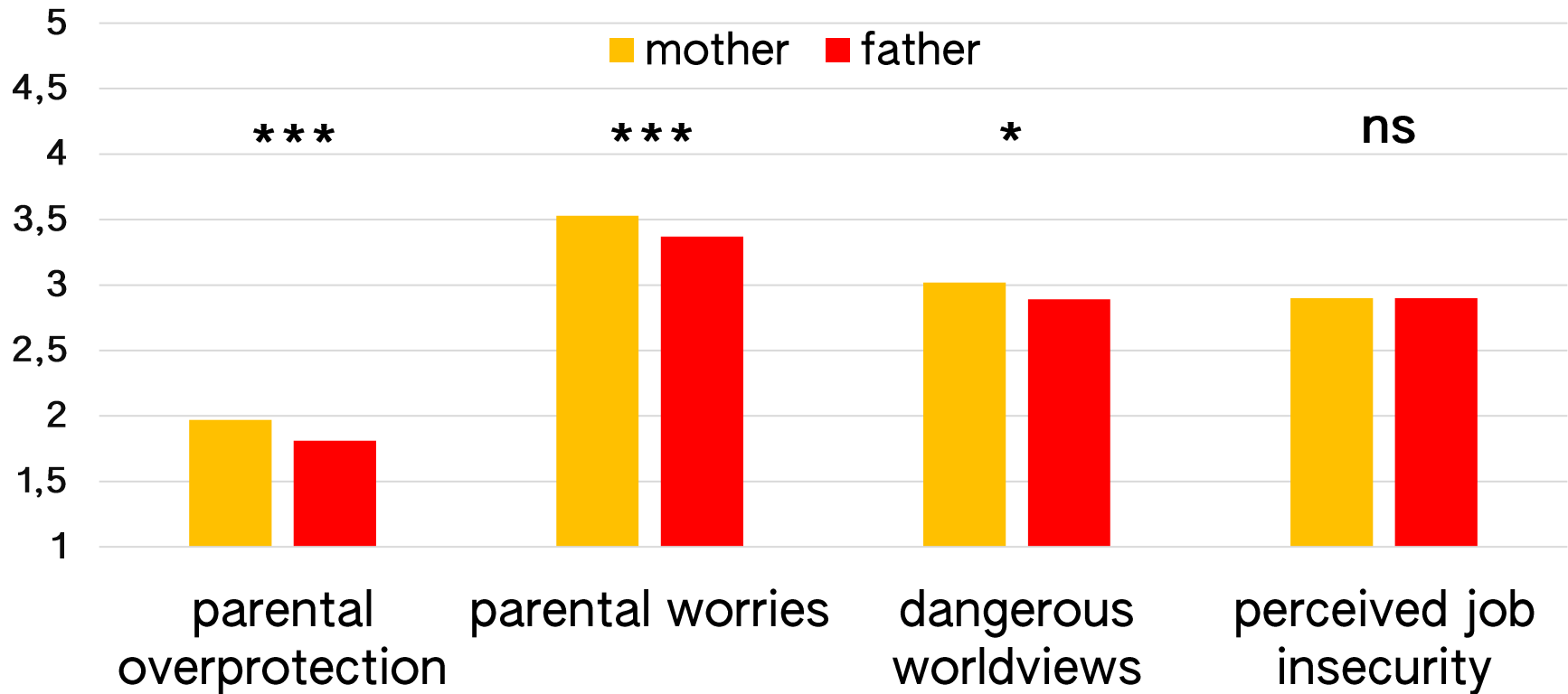
- « I worry too much about things that do not really matter » ($\alpha = .85/.87$)

Financial scarcity (12 items; Hilbert et al., 2021)

- « I often don't have the money to pay for the things I really need » ($\alpha = .91/.91$)

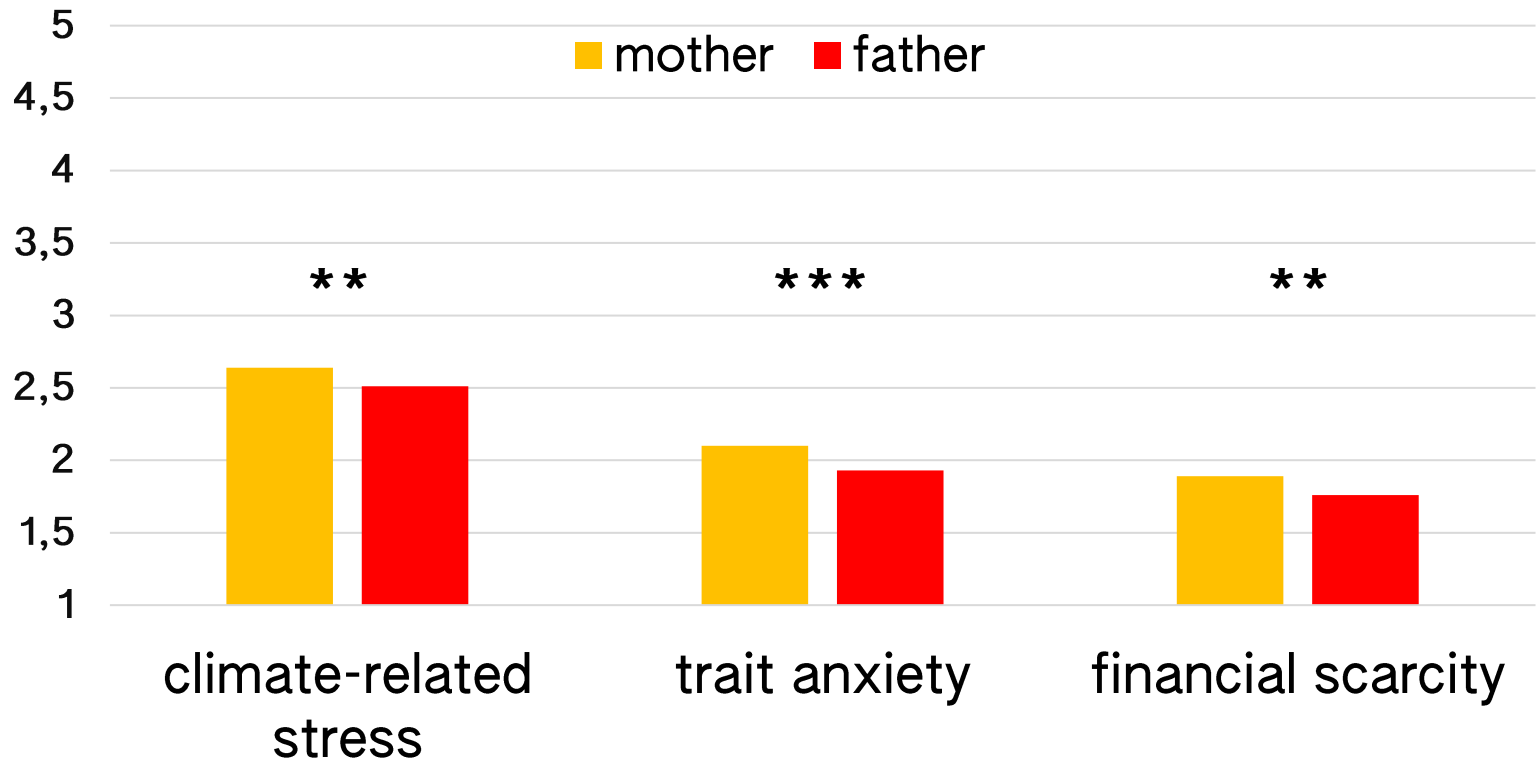

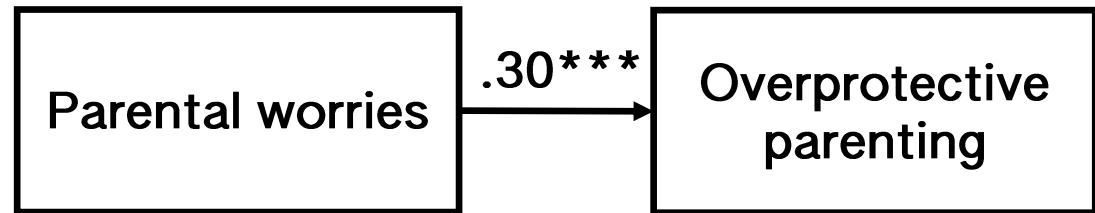

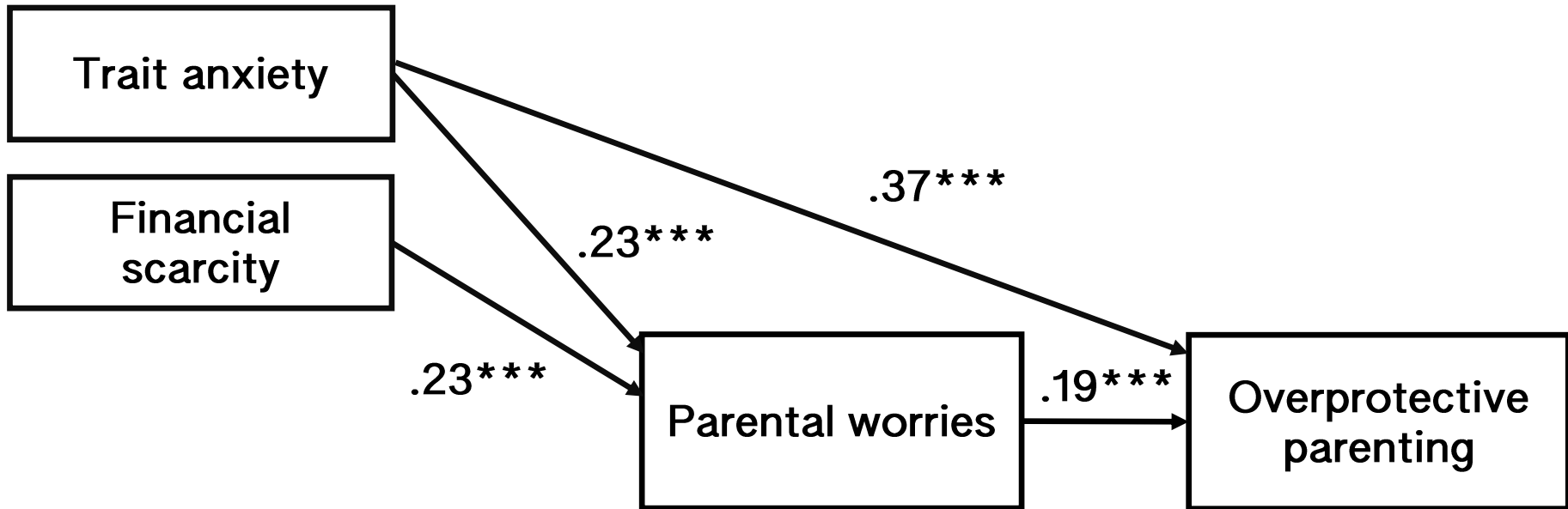

Main analyses: mother model



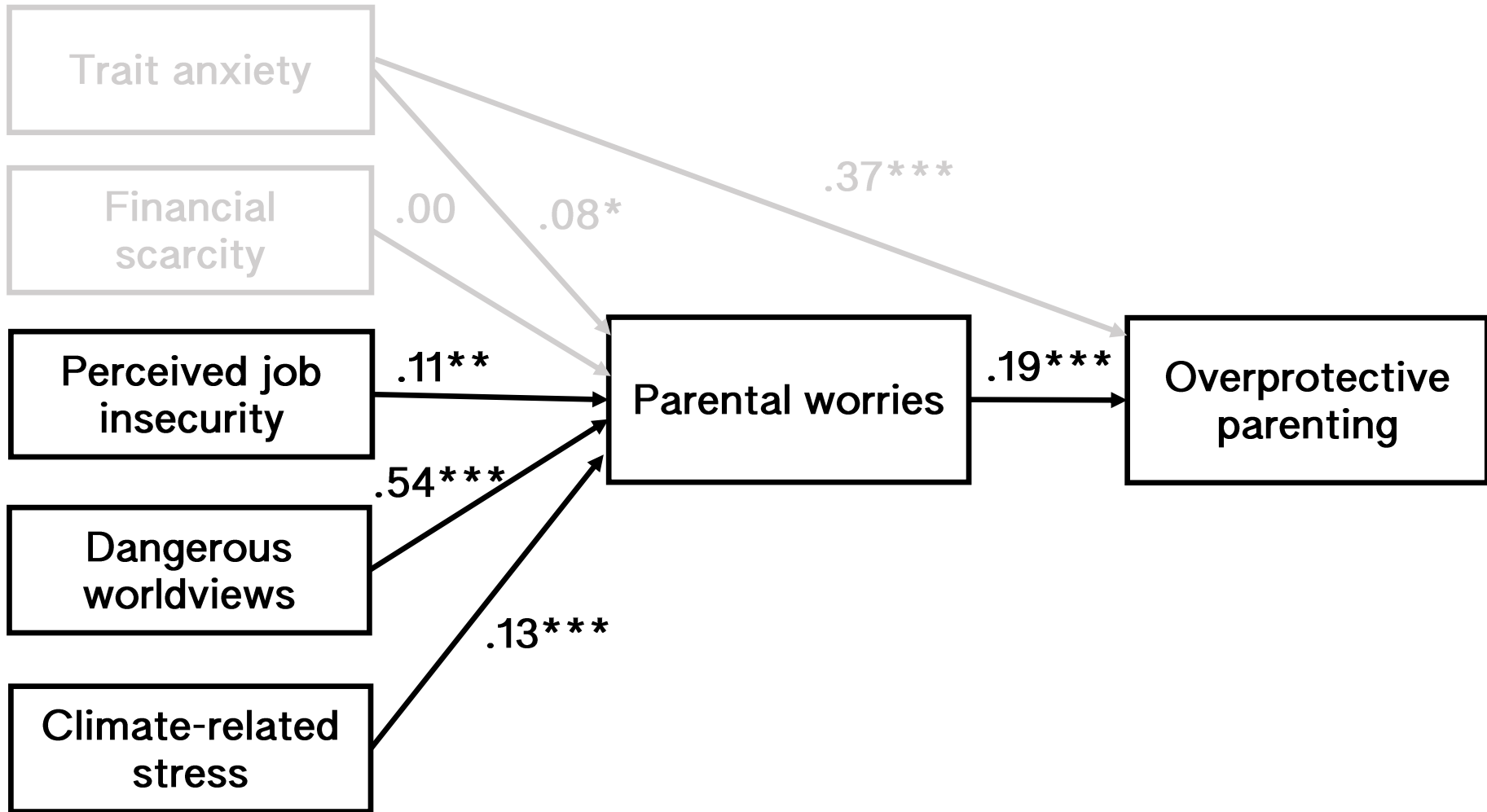

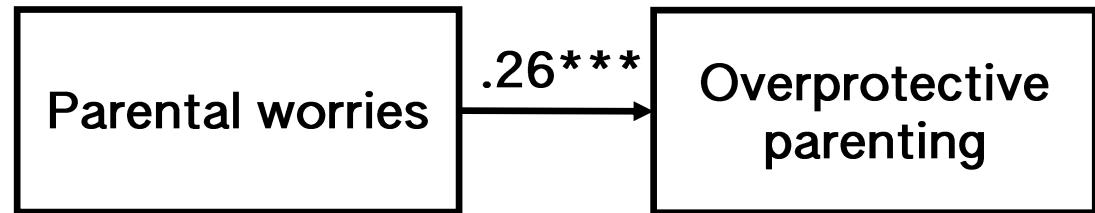

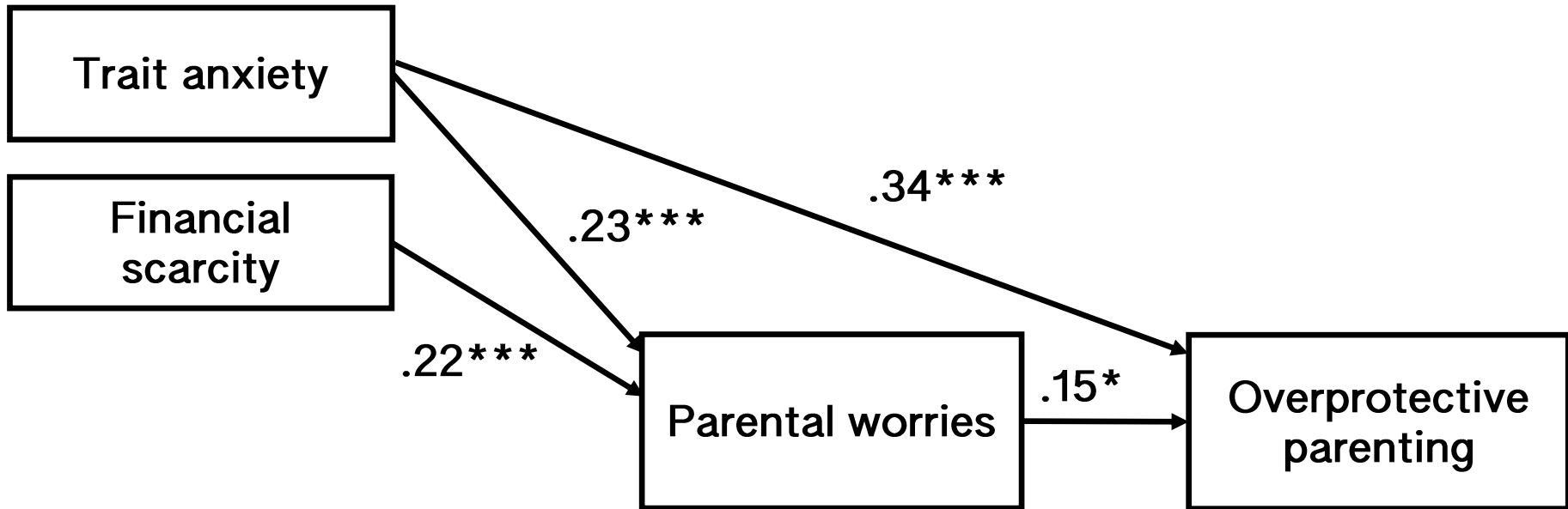

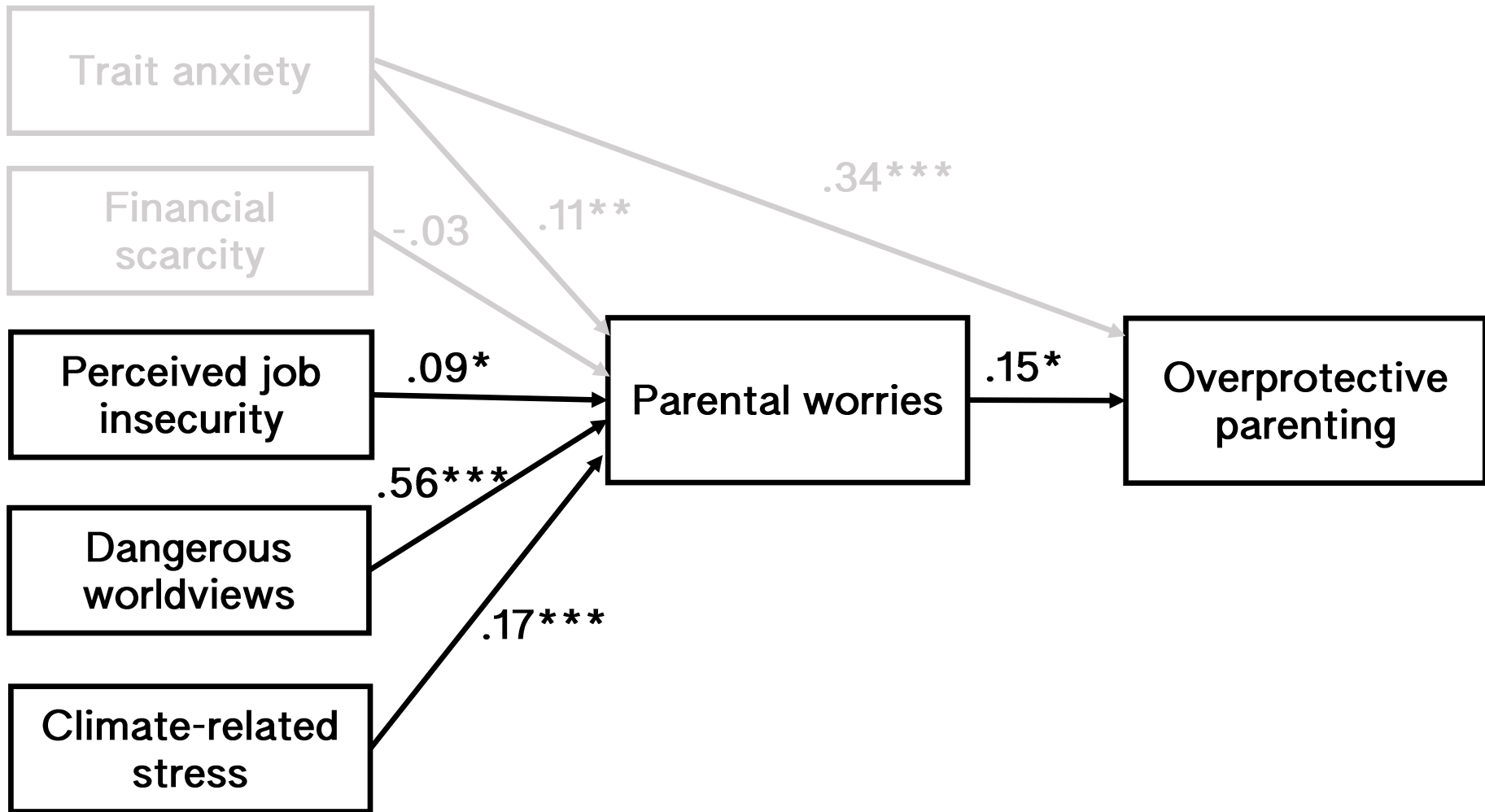

Discussion

Overview of findings

Context-related worries: partly explain overprotection

→ Similar for mothers and fathers

Above and beyond individual-level factors

Contextualize phenomenon of overprotection

→ Evolutionary? Smoke detector principle (Nesse, 2019)

- « better safe than sorry »

→ Refrain from parent-blaming (Bristow, 2014)
