#### PARENT THREAT BELIEFS

- threat in children's current and future environment in terms of scarcity and instability
- → culture of **fear**

## Theoretical Background

#### OVERPROTECTIVE PARENTING

- excessive protection considering the child's developmental level
- negative outcomes for children

# Parents' climate change anxiety

- related to threat beliefs?
- which, in turn, are related to overprotective parenting?



### Instruments

#### 1. Climate change anxiety

"When I think about climate change, I feel worried" (5 items)

#### 2. Threat beliefs

"It makes me nervous to think about all the dangers kids are exposed to today" (10 items)


#### 3. Overprotective parenting

"I often take tasks out of my child's hands without giving him/her the chance to try them by him/herself" (10 items)

### Instruments

#### Climate change anxiety

(5 items, adapted from STAI-short, Ogunbode et al., 2021)

- Negative feelings about climate change
- "When I think about climate change, I feel worried"
- $\alpha = .86 .87 \text{ (M-F)}$

#### Threat beliefs

(10 items, World Out There, Gurland & Grolnick, 2005)

- "It makes me nervous to think about all the dangers kids are exposed to today"
- $\alpha = .84 .84 \text{ (M-F)}$

#### Overprotective parenting

(10 items, MOPS, Chevrier et al., 2021)

- "I often take tasks out of my child's hands without giving him/her the chance to try them by him/herself"
- $\alpha = .82 .81 \text{ (M-F)}$



# Sample

- N= 891 parents of adolescents in Belgium
- 514 mothers (58%) and 380 fathers (42%)
- Parents' age: M= 49,6 (5.14)
- Parent's education: 46,9% have a university degree
- Adolescents' age: M= 17,0 (SD = 0.93)
- 54,6% girls and 45.3% boys
