Introduction

VIOLENT PARENTING

- Exposure to abuse and neglect in early childhood can have long-term consequences on child's physical and mental wellbeing (Arata et al., 2005)
- Child abuse is more prevalent in families with a lower SES
 (Altafim & Linhares)
- Insufficient parenting skills as potential cause of child maltreatment (Van Petegem et al., 2015; Portwood et al., 2011)
- Parenting training can be a helpful prevention tool (Sanders et al., 2014)

ACT-PARENTS RAISING SAFE KIDS

- Developed by American Psychological Association
- Internationally active
- Provide parents with necessary tools to develop positive parenting skills
- Main objectives:
 - Prevention of violent parenting
 - Protecting children from violence and abuse

PREVIOUS FINDINGS

- Improvements in positive discipline
- More adaptive emotion regulation in children and parents
- Reduction of physical and verbal punishment
- Improvements in monitoring children's media use
- Improved communication skills
- (Altafim & Linhares, 2019; Knox et al., 2013; Magalhaes et al., 2018; Pedro et al., 2017; Portwood et al., 2011)

Intervention Description

- 9 2-hour group-sessions
- Parents and caregivers of children of 0-10 years old
- Culturally sensitive
- Accessible for low SES populations
 - Offered for free
 - No literacy skills needed

Program Content

Pre-meeting: Motivational Interview & introduction

- 1. Leanring and understanding children's behaviors
- 2. Young children's exposure to violence
- 3. Understanding and controlling parents' anger
- 4. Understanding and helping angry children
- 5. Children and screen time
- 6. Discipline and parenting style
- 7. Discipline techniques for positive behaviors
- 8. Empowering parents

Research Goals

1. TRANSLATIONS AND CULTURAL ADAPTATIONS

- Translation of 3 manuals in French & Dutch
- Adaptations to Belgian cultural context

2. PROGRAM EFFICACY

- Effective for parenting behaviors and parental mental health?
- Effective for low SES populations?
- What mechanisms play a role in the program's efficacy?

Method

PILOT STUDY (currently running)

- Test translated program materials
- First glimpse at program efficacy

SAMPLE

- N = 3 Moroccan mothers
- $M_{\text{age}} = 35.67 \text{ years}$

MEASURES

- Pre-post questionnaires
 - Parental mental health
 - Parenting behaviors
 - Child internalizing-externalizing behaviors
- Weekly questionnaires before & after each session regarding content of the past week or the session content
- Weekly questionnaires for facilitators



Potential Outcomes

- Program efficacy?
 - Improved parenting strategies & parental mental health;
 - Use of positive discipline
 - Decrease in harsh parenting practices
 - Adaptive emotion regulation strategies
 - Decrease in depressive symptoms and parental stress
- Role of SES?
 - May play a moderating role
- Underlying mechanisms?
 - Group alliance

Challenges

- Recruitment: organizations & participants
- Method: use of questionnaires
