

When Sexting Becomes "Sexteen": Exploring Parental Representations and Regulations of Adolescent Sexting

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Introduction

Sexting = electronic sending of self-made explicit sexual or intimate content (Walrave et al., 2018)

Sexting and adolescents:

- -1 in 7 sends sexts, while 1 in 4 receives them (Madigan et al., 2018)
- Developmental aspects: Risky behavior VS Sexual exploration (e.g., Graham Holmes et al., 2021)
- Gender stereotypes? "Slut-shaming", "victim-blaming" (Lipmann & Cambel, 2014)

Adolescent sexting and parenting:

- Parents' definitions of sexting more negative than adolescents' definitions (i.e., links with pornography) (Barrense-Dias et al., 2019)
- Developing media interest for youth sexting as a new form of "moral panic" (e.g., Friedersdorf, 2015)
- → Parental "responsibility"? Monitoring VS mediation (Draper, 2012)
- Parental representations of this new trend? → Push parents to adopt different practices?


Gender and Sexting: An Ambivalence

RESEARH GOALS

Explore in depth parents' representations and regulations of adolescent sexting

> -10 interviews with Belgian parents of adolescents (age 16-18)

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- Reflexive thematic analysis (Braun and Clarke, 2019)

Different (Social) Consequences for Girls \rightarrow

So yes, the consequences (for boys) are perhaps less serious in a patriarchal society because, men...for them it's...There's a lot more that's allowed, and if there is a depiction of their intimacy in the public space, we're going to find a way to cherish it, whereas it's going to be a disgrace for a woman...

The Role of an Adolescent's Parent

- Themes actively produced by the researcher at the "intersection of data, analytic process and subjectivity" (Braun & Clarke, 2019).

- Codes and themes discussed between coders to reach consensus
